

RSS mulls expansion of base in all development blocks of India

DHARWAD, OCT 30 /--/ The Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh as part of expanding its activities is mulling reaching all development blocks of the country in the next three years, RSS general secretary Dattatreya Hosabale said on Saturday. "We have decided to expand our activities. At present we have our presence in 4,683 out of 6,483 development blocks but we want to reach all the development blocks of India by March 2024," Hosabale said, briefing reporters on the decisions taken during the three-day Akhil Bharatiya Karyakari Mandal (ABKM) meeting here, which concluded today. The Sangh has also appealed to those who wish to volunteer to work for two years to expand its base across India and ensure its presence in all the development blocks by 2025 when it celebrates its centenary. The RSS functionary said the Sangh does not have its activities in Mizoram, Nagaland, Kashmir and Lakshadweep. He added that the Sangh was running its Shakhas in Kashmir but after the migration of Hindus from there, activities were affected. After reaching their states, the regional Pracharakas of the RSS will have to plan a strategy in their states for the Sangh's expansion.

Speaking about the Sangh's activities, Hosabale said the daily Shakhya operations are taking place at 34,000 places, which was earlier disrupted due to Covid-19. "Sangh Shakhya held at 55,000 places including daily Shakhya (branch), weekly Shakhya, fortnightly and monthly Shakhya," the RSS leader said. Since this year is the platinum jubilee of Indian independence, the Sangh has decided to organise exhibitions remembering the contributions of great freedom fighters as well as many unsung heroes of the freedom struggle, Hosabale said. He said the Sangh is also planning to organise various events paying tributes to the ninth Sikh Guru, Tegh Bahadur. The Sangh also wants to focus on employment generation and skill development. To a query on population policy, Hosabale said every nation should have a population policy which should be applicable to all. He also said the Sangh had passed a resolution to this effect a few years ago. (PTI)

BJP MLA, 6 BSP legislators join SP in UP; Akhilesh taunts ruling party

LUCKNOW, OCT 30 /--/ Seven legislators - one from the BJP and six suspended from the BSP - joined the Samajwadi Party (SP) in Uttar Pradesh on Saturday in the presence of Akhilesh Yadav, who hit out at Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath and also claimed the BJP and the Congress "are the same". "The people of the state are so agitated that the BJP will be wiped out in the coming days and Bhajpa pariwar (BJP family) will appear as Bhaagta Pariwar (runaway family)," the SP chief said here while taunting the ruling party over its MLA Rakesh Rathore's desertion and indicating that some others from the BJP were also in

touch with him in the poll-bound state. Those who joined the SP - BJP MLA from Sitapur Rakesh Rathore and BSP rebels Aslam Raini (Shrawati), Sushma Patel (Madiyahan), Aslam Ali (Hapur), Hakim Lal Bidd (Handia), Mujtaba Siddiqui (Phoolpur) and Hargovind Bhargava (Sidhauri) - expressed their resolve to make Akhilesh Yadav the chief minister again in the coming elections.

Taking to Twitter, Yadav claimed that the BJP will not get enough ticket aspirants "even if it declares 403 chief ministers" as the party is starting at defeat in the assembly polls. The UP

Assembly's strength is 403. Earlier this year, an audio clip purportedly of Rathore criticising Prime Minister Narendra Modi for asking people to clap and clang bells and plates during the Covid-19 pandemic had gone viral on social media, after which he was asked by the party leadership to explain his alleged anti-party activities. The BSP rebels who joined the SP were suspended by BSP president Mayawati after they had opposed the nomination of the party's official candidate Ramji Gautam for Rajya Sabha in October 2020.

They had reportedly met Akhilesh Yadav earlier this year and had hinted that

they may switch sides soon. Yadav also took a swipe at Union Home Minister Amit Shah for saying that 90 percent works of the BJP manifesto have been completed and the 10 percent remaining in the 'Lok Lalyan Sankalp Patra' will be taken up in the next few months. Yadav said it seems that the BJP leaders have not gone through its pages and have forgotten about what all was there in their manifesto. "The first thing mentioned in it was for the farmers that a roadmap to double their income will be prepared by 2022 and they assured farmers in this regard from various platforms. I want to know what has happened to it," he said reading out for the BJP's 2017 manifesto and asked about the fate of other promises as well.

The SP chief also again distanced himself from the party's former ally Congress. "The opinion of Samajwadis for the Congress and BJP is that both are the same," the SP chief said to a query. (PTI)

After Ganga, Centre planning to set limits for minimum flow of water for its tributaries

NEW DELHI, OCT 30 /--/ The Centre is planning to set limits for the minimum flow of water in various Ganga tributaries like Yamuna to have uninterrupted flow, which will ensure its cleanliness, a senior official said.

In 2018, the National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG) released the e-flow notification for Ganga, which refers to the quality, quantity and timing of water flows required to maintain the components, functions, processes, and resilience of river ecosystems that provide goods and services to people. On the same lines, the NMCG is now planning to set limits for the minimum flow of water in various Ganga tributaries like Yamuna to have uninterrupted flow to ensure its cleanliness, NMCG Director General Rajiv Ranjan Mishra said. "Setting minimum flow of water has helped us maintain an incessant flow of river Ganga. Further, to maintain the minimum flow of Ganga tributaries such as Yamuna and other rivers, the NMCG is in the planning stage to provide technical and analytical

support by carrying out a detailed evidence-based assessment of the environmental flows, where significant flow regime modification has occurred post human interventions," he told PTI.

Mishra said the planned intervention is in the proposal development stage for taking up study towards assessment of environmental flows in critical reaches of small rivers and tributaries of the Ganga river system. Mishra further said that the NMCG is working to enumerate the floodplains within 10 km of river Ganga by creating the inventories and developing integrated basin management plan to promote recharging groundwater and other waterbodies, which will ultimately contribute towards cleaning and maintaining continuous flow of Ganga river. The wetlands are considered to be an intrinsic part of the Ganga Basin and it is important to protect, conserve and rejuvenate them for the holistic development of Ganga river.

The wetlands serve as the natural treatment system, which removes the toxic substances to drain into the river system, along with this it acts as a carbon sink, habitat for biodiversity and aquatic life and maintains the

of rivers, which keep them alive. "Within the NMCG programme, the wetlands are approached by distinguishing them in two categories i.e., floodplain wetlands and urban wetlands. The floodplain wetlands are the ones found closer to the rivers and urban wetlands are those existing in cities or urban areas. The urban wetlands are usually in more danger due to encroachment and construction being done at the wetland sites," Mishra said. He said to manage the urban wetland, the NMCG collaborated with the School for Planning and Architecture (SPA) to develop a toolkit for local stakeholders - 'Urban: Wetland Management Guidelines'. The toolkit has showcased the Bhagalpur Wetland case of lost waterbodies over the decades and how it relates to other rivers such as Champa river. The Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs has circulated the toolkit for guiding urban managers of all the cities and rivers situated at the bank of rivers or lakes, he added. Mishra said the NMCG is working with the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare for scaling up organic farming and agroforestry in Ganga states to boost farmers' income, improve water use and crop diversification. Shah seeks another mandate for BJP for Uttarakhand's continued development

DEHRADUN, OCT 30 /--/ Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Saturday said Uttarakhand has taken big strides in terms of development due to the vision of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and sought another mandate for the BJP in the coming elections to spur the state further on the path of development under the leadership of Modi and young Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhama.

Launching his party's poll campaign in Uttarakhand at a public rally at the Bannu school ground here, Shah said Modi brought road and rail infrastructure development projects worth Rs 85,000 crore during his tenure and challenged the opposition Congress to show what it had done for the state during its time. "Congress was in power at the Centre for 10 years under the leadership of Manmohan Singh.

What did it do for Uttarakhand during the period? It should tell the people of the state," he said. Modi's vision for the reconstruction of Kedarnath which had suffered extensive damage in the 2013 disaster led to the never-seen-before development in and around the temple, he said. The Prime Minister will unveil a statue of Adi Guru Shankaracharya in Kedarnath during his visit to the temple on November 5. Modi's forthcoming visit to the Himalayan temple will mark the completion of the first phase of reconstruction works in Kedarpuri and beginning of the second phase. (PTI)

Delhi HC seeks Centre's response to plea for issuance of ration card to daily wage worker

NEW DELHI, OCT 30 /--/ The Delhi High Court has sought the Centre's stand on a petition for issuance of ration card to a daily wage worker, who had applied for it eight years ago, after the Delhi government claimed that it has already reached the limit on issuance of cards set by central authorities.

The Delhi government told Justice Rekha Palli that based on the 2011 census, the Centre has set a limit of 72 lakh ration cards, which stands exhausted and, therefore, it cannot be faulted for not having issued a ration card to the daily wage worker. The court was hearing the petition by the daily wage worker seeking a ration card in a time-bound manner, with the names of all her family members.

Earlier this month, the court had sought the Delhi government's stand on why the application for issuance of a ration card by a daily wage worker was pending for eight years. On the last date, Mr. (Gautam) Narayan, learned counsel for respondent nos.2 to 4 was granted time to obtain instructions.

Today, he submits that no ration card could be issued to the petitioner as the limit for issuance of 72 lakh ration cards set by respondent no. 1, based on the Census of 2011, already stands exhausted and, therefore, the respondents nos.2 to 4 cannot be faulted for not having issued a ration card to the petitioner, the judge noted in her order dated October 25.

In the light of the stand taken by the respondents nos.2 to 4 i.e. the Government of NCT of Delhi, it is deemed necessary to have the stand of the respondent no.1, i.e. the Union of India as well, the order said. The court directed the Centre and the Delhi government to file their counter-affidavits within a period of four weeks and listed the matter for further hearing on January 5.

In the petition filed through lawyers Jayshree Satpute and Tripti Poddar, the petitioner has alleged that in spite of applying for a ration card in September 2013 and making repeated representations, no action was taken by the authorities. The petitioner informed that she and her family reside in a "juggi" in South Delhi and the ration card issued in her husband's name in 2005 was unilaterally cancelled by authorities in 2013.

The petitioner said that she and her family are being denied their right to subsidised food grains owing to inactions and inefficiencies of the authorities.

The petitioner contended that was a violation of the Right to Food, Right to Health and Right to Life guaranteed under Article 21 of the Constitution of India.

The petitioner and her family continue to live in abject poverty, and are unable to provide food for their family, despite having applied for a ration card eight years prior, the petitioner has stated. (PTI)
